



What's Behind the Uptick?

A rise in action by conservative activists and lawmakers seeking to ban materials they view as being sexually explicit, obscene, or racially charged materials.

How would HB 516 & SB 226 protect students?

HB 516 & SB 226 have been introduced by Sen. Anivitarte & Rep. Karen Mathiak, to remove the allowance in the GA Code for schools that expose K-12 students to obscene materials via library books and online databases. According to GA Code 16-20-102, material is considered obscene if it depicts or describes sexual conduct, i.e., acts of sexual intercourse, masturbation, lewd exhibition of the genitals, sado-masochism, etc.

Overwhelming the System

Emotions are running higher

Hundreds of challenges reported to ALA OIF this year alone

Challenges take hours of staff time to investigate and resolve, leading to knee-jerk responses.

All This Leads to Self-Censorship

Avoiding certain phrases to avoid controversy (Black Lives Matter, LGBTQ+ Rights).

Stopping programs on controversial topics.

Avoiding purchasing materials that may cause problems in the future.

The "chilling effect" of censorship.


Books by Black authors and/or about the Black experience (particularly in relation to policing)

Any materials dealing with non-cisgender/heteronormative romance









Public Complaints

To Do Now:

Make sure your policies are up-to-date

Staff and board training

Create your "crisis" messaging plan



Understand Your Market

Not everyone can take up the same fights.

Understand your political context, your support levels, and your institutional context.

Talk to your administrators, boards, funders, and others to ensure that everyone is on the same page regarding IF-challenging topics.

Understand Your Power

Go ahead and reach out to your elected officials and state your case.

If you're a parent, be sure to reach out to your school board.

Public Complaints

Resolving in the Moment:

Calmly summarizing the complaint

Acknowledging the concern; addressing the emotion

Redirecting concern towards ways you can give them what they want



Practice!

People may be upset.

People may try to record you (legal in the state of Georgia).

Whenever possible, try to de-escalate in the moment rather than giving people the form.

Public Complaints

To Do When a Public Challenge Occurs:

Enlist support (Friends, library supporters, educators, parents)

Work the challenge process

Seek aid from outside groups as needed



Challenge Messaging

Professional library workers make these choices and work hard to match community need.

Challenge processes are already in place at the local level to respond to local needs.

Each parent has the right to control access for their child but not for anyone else's.

Internal Issues

Make sure your policies are up-to-date

Front-Line/Supervisor training
